

Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade 2015 live stream, performers: How to watch Thanksgiving parade online

The 89th annual Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade will be held Thanksgiving Day, Thursday, Nov. 26, in New York. The parade will be shown on NBC from 9 a.m.-noon in all time zones. Matt Lauer, Savannah Guthrie and Al Roker of NBC's "TODAY" will anchor the broadcast.

The parade will feature as many as 8,000 participants, starting at 77th Street and Central Park West then to Columbus Circle and Central Park South. The parade will then turn on 6th Ave. before making its last stop in front of Macy's Herald Square.

The parade always features a star-studded list of participants and this year's includes Mariah Carey, Dove Cameron and Sofia Carson, Panic! At the Disco, Prince Royce, and more. The Radio City Rockettes will kick off the event and the cast of NBC's "The Wiz Live!" will be taking part, too.

The Radio City Rockettes will kick off the event that will feature theatrical productions from "Fiddler on the Roof," "Finding Neverland," "The King & I," "On Your Feet!" and "Something Rotten." Fans can also catch a sneak peek performance of NBC's "The Wiz Live!" which premieres on Dec. 3 at 8 p.m.

The parade started in 1924, when it was known as the Macy's Christmas Parade. The first event featured live animals from the Central Park Zoo. The parade's iconic giant balloons debuted in 1927. Today, as many as 3.5 million spectators are expected to attend the Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade with 50 million watching via NBC.
