

How to watch the Eagles parade online

On Thursday, February 8 from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m., the Eagles and millions of its friends will celebrate the Birds' big Super Bowl win—the first in franchise history—with a victory parade and ceremony in Philly.

The parade will make its way from South Philly up Broad Street to the Benjamin Franklin Parkway, ending at the Philadelphia Museum of Art around noon. At 1 p.m. a special ceremony on the steps will take place until 3 p.m.

It's being hailed as what may be the largest event of its kind for the city, potentially drawing even more folks to the streets than the Phillies' World Series parade in 2008, when millions showed up to celebrate.

But no need to suffer from FOMO. If for whatever reason you can't make the big party, there are plenty of ways to watch the festivities without ever leaving your couch or workplace. We'll update this article as more information becomes available.
