

## 'X' still marks the spot of the sniper's perch live stream from the Sixth Floor Museum, now in high definition

There's been a live-streaming webcam aimed at Dealey Plaza out the so-called "sniper's perch" since June 1999, so telling you there's one there now hardly qualifies as breaking news. But this, I guess, does: It's now in high definition.

On Monday [EarthCam](#) upgraded the unblinking eyeball onto Elm Street, prompting this exclamatory tweet from the folks who are always watching: "[Our Dealey Plaza cam is now HD!](#) We teamed up with [@SixthFlrMuseum](#) to offer the only view from the #JFK sniper's perch." Beneath that, you'll also note some of the responses: "Seriously, turning an assassination into sport?" and "Sick and wrong." Also, to some, it's "strangely hypnotic" as you watch folks dodge Elm Street traffic to snap a quick picture.
