

Watch the Bay Area get a new bridge in just four minutes 9/4/2013

Bridge construction can be annoying when it interferes with your commute, but there is something fascinating about watching these giant structures come together. This new earthquake-resistant eastern span of the San Francisco-Oakland Bay Bridge took 11½ years to complete, and opened at 10:15 p.m. Monday night. Now, you can watch the last five years of construction fly by in just four minutes. EarthCam set up 12 cameras around the construction site in 2008, and they've captured nearly 2 million images since. The streaming video company condensed all that footage into this short time-lapse video. Sure, the bridge cost \$5 billion over budget, but it does look cool going up.
