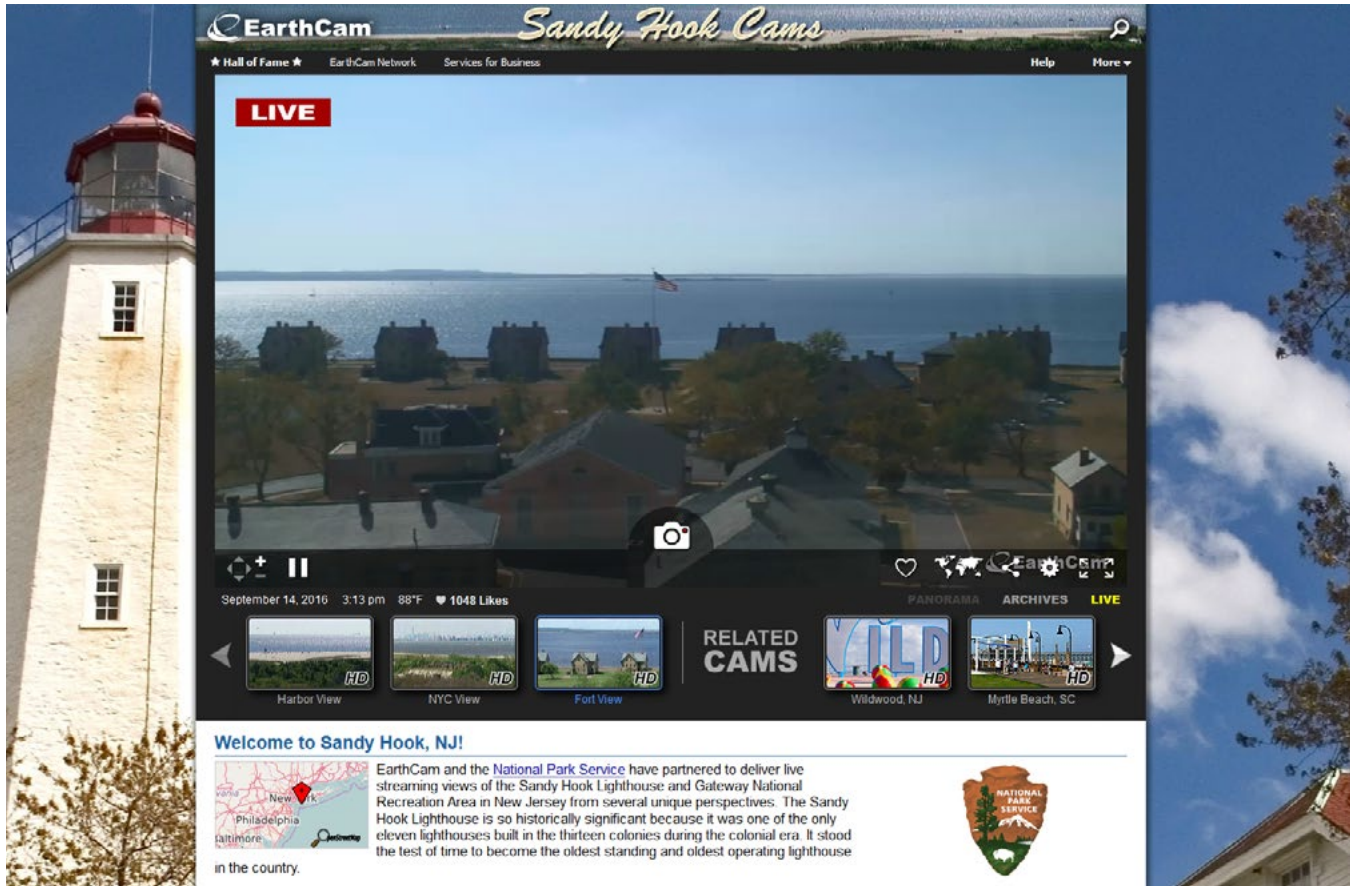


## Jersey Shore live cams: Views of beaches as Hermine bears down on N.J.

Tropical Storm Hermine was expected to bring high winds, rough surf and could hit the Jersey Shore with the region's most severe coastal flooding since Superstorm Sandy, according to forecasts.

Gov. Chris Christie on Saturday declared a state of emergency for Ocean, Atlantic and Cape May counties ahead of the storm.

Dozens of live web cams continually stream conditions along the Jersey Shore, most often to the benefit of surfers and those looking in on crowded beaches.

Attheshore.com has more than 100 live cams, and thesurfersview.com has streams of more than a dozen Jersey Shore beaches. Some beach communities like Avalon in Cape May County have set up municipal cameras to monitor beach and bay conditions. And the National Park Service provides live looks in multiple directions through [earthcam.com](http://earthcam.com) from Sandy Hook.
