

Super Bowl 2014: Watch MetLife Stadium be built in 38 seconds

In about the time it takes for one of the Super Bowl's famed commercials, MetLife Stadium goes from ground to grand.

EarthCam, which also has construction time lapses of the new World Trade Center, the Minnesota Vikings stadium roof deflation and the Seaside Heights boardwalk, on Friday released a YouTube video of MetLife Stadium's rise to commemorate the home of the Super Bowl a week from today.

EarthCam uses high definition megapixel cameras to document work on construction sites.

The time-lapse shows the before, after and a little bit of the in between for the 2 1/2 year, \$1.6 billion construction project on the stadium that holds the fans of the Giants and Jets and such musical acts as U2 and Bruce Springsteen and the E Street Band.

The best thing about the time-lapse movie of the first outdoor Super Bowl cold-weather stadium: There was nary a snowflake in sight.
